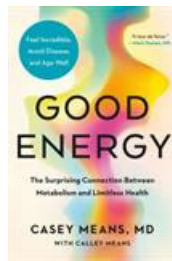

Admission and popcorn are free, thanks to the support of the Coopersville Sportsman's Club!

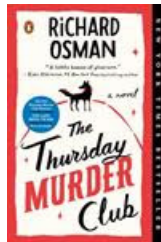


## 2024 Summer Reading Begins: June 10
